 - (b) Bring out the dramatic significance of the Murder Scene in Edward II.
 - (c) How is Twelfth Night remarkable for its atmosphere of wit, humour and joyous spirit?

Who says this and to whom? Under what circumstances does the speaker say so? What is the significance of the advice?

- (c) The mightiest kings have had their minions'.
 Which kings and minions do Elder Moutimer refer to ?
